We also added a changing table to the women's locker room for your convenience and have replaced the rules signs so please check those out and help us to ensure that all rules are continually followed.

We also completed our renovation of the HVAC system for the Ballroom and Men's Lounge. As many of you know the units that heated and cooled those areas are well over twenty years old. As the summer got hot the systems began struggling to keep those areas cool during some of the extremely hot days and nights which left us with no choice but to replace both units. This was a huge undertaking for us, but, has provided the type of climate-controlled environment necessary to host all our many wonderful events while also keeping our ballroom as one the premier locations to host an event in the Mt. Hermon community.

The family events put on by the Social Committee were a huge hit and were a first for our club. The taproom, which had been due for some upgrades for quite some time was provided some much-needed equipment. We installed a brand-new stove and oven which was converted to gas to allow for quicker preparation of your food. As many of you have seen, JJ has been manning the Taproom quite a bit as well with staffing issues that are affecting not only us but the restaurant industry as whole. He also completely redesigned and revamped the menu. I encourage each of you to look this over and try some of the new items as they are absolutely delicious.





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On the course we enjoyed the finest playing surface in the area by far. Wes did an incredible job on improving and maintaining the course this grass season. As it pertains to golfing surface and play, we made several decisions to invest heavily in this area. We ordered and received 900 new Titleist range balls that were cycled into use. We had Payton Criswell continue the tree removal process that was started 3 years ago. We replaced numerous pieces of equipment to aid the efficiency of the staff and fixed the irrigation as it continues to age. In addition to that the Greens Committee has compiled a list of future projects that will have to be completed to maintain the beauty of the course. This includes sodding the right side of number 17 and repairing the drained pond on number 14.

I also want to thank everyone for helping us with reinstituting the regular cart rules back into place as COVID waned. We understand the convenience provided by the COVID cart rules and understand the effort that it took to get back to normal. We thank you all for making the adjustment one that was smooth and for continuing to sacrifice to protect the wonderful playing surface that we all love.

Lastly, please don't forget to continually check your email for our email blasts of upcoming events. The tournament committee and social committee are working diligently to finalize the event schedule and we plan to have it out in its entirety soon. All leaves have been cleaned up from the course. We are working on additional water line breaks at # 4 and at # 8. The leak at # 4 is a big one with water line tees going in two directions with several valves. Due to the age of our irrigation system, this will be an ongoing issue. We continue limbing up trees around the club house, edging beds, and clearing underbrush behind #6 green. Cleanup work is starting in the wooded area between # 9 tee box and #3 fairway. Pampas grass has been cut back beside driving range and behind #13 tee box.

Several trees that were blown over during the recent storm have been removed. Water pipes froze in both course bathrooms. A couple of these issues was due to the power going off and heaters in the bathrooms did not come back on to prevent the temperature from getting too cold. These have been repaired.






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Breaking News

On Christmas night, a water pipe burst in the 1st floor cart shed. This is a dry pipe sprinkler system that is filled with pressurized air or nitrogen instead of water to prevent frozen and burst sprinkler pipes in areas with colder temperatures. Unfortunately, water had seeped into the line which caused it to freeze. The first-floor hallway from this area flooded as well as a couple of inches in the basement area where the carts are stored. Since the drainage was stopped up at the sump pump, Pete had to clear the debris before the pump would state working. FCS was called in to clean the basement and a plumber will fix the broken pipes in the 1st floor cart shed. Estimated damage was minimal around \$1,000. Insurance deductible is \$2,500.
